Bajaur Agency

On 28th January, tribal elders, political leaders and social activists of the agency voiced dissatisfaction with the performance of non-governmental organizations and complained that they didn't offer employment opportunities to the educated local residents by and large.

On 31st January, people from different walks of life in Bajaur Agency warmly welcomed the decision of Prime Minister Mohammad Nawaz Sharif to constitute a four-member committee for holding peace talks with Taliban.

On 2nd February, agency's administration warned local non-governmental organizations of strict action over denial of half of their jobs to local tribesmen.

Mohmand Agency

On 28th January, tribal elders demanded of the authorities to reopen trade route to Afghanistan via Mohmand Agency that has been closed for the last five years.

On 31st January, political administration during a search operation recovered four kidnapped persons and arrested two alleged kidnappers in Prang Ghar area in Mohmand Agency.

On 31st January, three workers were killed in a marble quarry collapse in Prang Ghar area in Mohmand Agency.

1st February, different tribes of lower Mohmand Agency announced full support to government in its efforts to wipe out the menace of militancy and terrorism and vowed to fight shoulder to shoulder with the security forces till elimination of the last militant.

Kurram Agency

On 29th January, woman was killed and two others were injured when two landmine explosions occurred in the Kurram tribal region.

On 30th January, elders from Kurram Agency expressed anguish over the government's failure to rehabilitate them as they have been suffering from military operations and large-scale displacements.

Orakzai Agency

On 30th January, two workers were killed and five others sustained injuries when a coalmine collapsed in Doli area in Orakzai Agency.

Khyber Agency

On 28th January, newly elected president of Tribal Union of Journalists (TUJ) Khyber Agency along with cabinet members met with Advisor to Prime Minister Engineer Ameer Muqam Khan and apprised him of issues being faced by journalists in the agency.

On 31st January, two children were killed when a mortar shell went off in Tabay area of Bazaar Zakhakhel in Landikotal tehsil.

On 31st January, father killed whereas the son was injured when rival group opened fire at them in Landikotal tehsil of the agency.

1st February, four people were killed in a clash between two rival militant groups in tehsil Bara of Khyber Agency.

On 2nd February, doctors at the agency headquarters hospital in Landi Kotal have diagnosed over 250 patients with cutaneous leishmaniasis disease.

North Waziristan Agency

On 27th January, reports revealed that thousands of people fled their homes in North Waziristan fearing a military offensive against Taliban insurgents.

On 28th January, two suspected militants were killed in the ongoing military operation in the Mirali area of North Waziristan Agency (NWA) that was started without giving a warning to the locals.

On 29th January, Six security personnel were injured when their vehicle met with an accident while on way to Kohat from North Waziristan.

On 30th January, sources told that tribal families that had fled their villages in Mir Ali tehsil in North Waziristan to escape possible military action after the January 19 bomb attack on the security forces' convoy in Bannu have started returning to their homes.

On 31st January, TTP said the final decision about the proposed peace talks with the government would be taken by their Shura within the next few days.

On 2nd February, Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) named a five-member committee including the Pakistan Tehrik-e-Insaf (PTI) head Imran Khan to represent it in the proposed peace talks with the government-appointed four-member panel.

South Waziristan Agency

On 31st January, a senior Taliban commander told on the condition of anonymity that a high-level meeting of Shura held somewhere in SWA for the first time to review the ongoing situation about the peace talks.

KPK

On 27th January, spokesperson for the banned Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) said that it once again offers 'serious' and 'meaningful' dialogue to the government.

On 27th January, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Pervez Khattak said his party would oppose a military operation if the government failed to implement the resolution of the All-Party Conference regarding talks with militants.

On 27th January, President Mamnoon Hussain said the army is fully ready for an operation against the terrorists, and only awaiting a green signal from the government.

On 27th January, Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) chief Maulana Fazlur Rahman came hard on the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa government and termed it a representative of the West and asked the Government to immediately announce a ceasefire and give tribal jirgas a chance to negotiate.

On 27th January, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Imran Khan warned that war without using the option of talks would be dangerous, and he cannot see the army being destroyed.

On 27th January, advisor to Prime Minister Engineer Amir Muqam said that government is willing to hold talks with the Taliban.

On 27th January, unidentified persons threw an explosive device into the house of Senator Muhammad Saleh Shah Qureshi in Kot Murtaza in the precincts of the Gomal Bazaar Police Station, Tank, but no damage was caused.

On 27th January, police arrested four Afghan refugees and four proclaimed offenders during a search operation in refugee camps and other localities in district Lakki Marwat of KPK.

On 27th January, KPK government sources said that following serious threats to the immunisation workers, around 3,500 policemen will be deployed during coming campaign in the provincial capital as part of unprecedented security to be provided to the volunteers.

On 27th January, police arrested three militants and seized arms from them in the Barikot tehsil of the Swat district.

On 27th January, unidentified armed men shot dead a member of the peace body at Rang Mohalla in Swat Valley.

On 27th January, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Governor Eng. Shaukatullah Khan approved the establishment of a Cricket Academy for the children/youth of FATA.

On 28th January, majority of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) parliamentary party members in a meeting supported an operation against the Taliban.

On 28th January, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK) Chief Minister Pervaiz Khattak said that his government wants the authority to hold a dialogue with the Taliban if the federal government could not do it.

On 28th January, Interior Minister Chaudhry Nisar Ali Khan said that neither a dialogue with the Taliban will succeed nor will an operation against them bear the desired result if there is no government-opposition consensus.

On 28th January, Minister for Information and Broadcasting and National Heritage Pervaiz Rashid said that those who had a soft corner for the Taliban should be held accountable.

On 28th January, a police officer was killed and five constables were injured in Tank when an improvised explosive device (IED) struck their vehicle

On 28th January, suspected militants killed three members of a family in Mashokehl area in the limits of Badhber police station Peshawar.

On 28th January, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Inspector General of Police Nasir Khan Durrani proposed to the provincial government that the tribal youth be accommodated in the police force and other government departments for bringing the tribal area in the national mainstream.

On 28th January, Police officials claimed to have arrested 500 outlaws including five terrorists during a fifteen days crackdown against anti-social elements and criminals of various natures in different parts of Mardan, Sawabi, Charsadda and Nowshera.

On 28th January 2014, central Spokesperson of Tehrik Taliban Pakistan (TTP) Shahidullah Shahid said TTP was an ideological and military organization that does not believe in the politics of hypocrisy and fraud.

On 29th January, Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Sami (JUI-S) chief Maulana Samiul Haq charged that the US had stopped Prime Minister Muhammad Nawaz Sharif from holding peace dialogue with the Taliban.

On 29th January, security experts and senior politicians, including heads of the country's three main religious parties, warned that after the withdrawal of US from Afghanistan the security situation in the region would worsen.

On 29th January, IG Punjab in a letter stated that in the wake of an expected military operation in North Waziristan, it is feared that militants would move to Punjab in the garb of internally-displaced persons (IDPs) and carry out their activities.

On 29th January, chief of his own faction Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F), Maulana Fazl Ur Rehman, called for holding of an All Parties Conference for consensus over talks with Taliban ahead of any military operation against them.

On 30th January, the prime minister constituted a four-member committee, headed by his Adviser on National Affairs, Irfan Siddique, to establish contact with Taliban and pave the way for a dialogue.

On 30th January, TTP convened a Shura meeting to constitute its team for holding talks with the government.

On 30th January, White House reaffirmed the US commitment to continue cooperation with Pakistan to help promote economic development, peace and security for the people of the key regional country.

On 30th January, Inspector General of Police Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Nasir Khan Durrani prepared drafts of two Acts and submitted the same to the provincial government for legislation from the assembly in order to effectively counter terrorism in the province.

On 30th January, internally displaced persons of Bara staged a protest demonstration against the Peshawar Electric Supply Company for disconnecting power supply to Jalozei camp.

On 31st January, PTI Chairman Imran Khan on Thursday spelt out five conditions for a meaningful dialogue between the government and the Taliban.

On 31st January, Director, US National Intelligence stated in a Senate Intelligence meeting that The Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) of Pakistan remain the al Qaeda movement's ideological center but there are at least five franchises in 12 countries.

On 31st January, two people among a nine-year old child were killed and another injured when unidentified armed men on motorcycle opened fire on them in Urmar area of Peshawar.

On 1st February, a four member committee constituted by the government formally invited the Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) for peace talks and urged the outlawed militant organization to immediately nominate its interlocutors and convey its demands for starting the dialogue process.

On 2nd February, Irfan Siddiqui vowed that if the committee members would have to go to North Waziristan for talks with the Taliban, they would go there for the larger interest of the country even without caring for any danger to their lives.

On 2nd February, four volunteers of an anti-Taliban peace body were killed in a clash with militants in Mahokhel, a suburb of Peshawar City.

On 2nd February, four suspected militants were killed in a pre-dawn encounter with police in Razaar Tehsil of Swabi district.

On 2nd February, Major (R) Amir, member of Government-backed committee for talks with Taliban met Lal Masjid Khatib Maulana Abdul Aziz.
