Bajaur Agency

On 17th January, political administration of Bajaur Agency rehabilitated militancy affected three government schools for boys in Baro village, Shin Kot and Hilal Kheil village of Nawagai.

On 19th January, two persons were injured in a roadside blast in Mamond subdivision of Bajaur Agency.

Mohmand Agency

Khyber Agency

On 16th January, two volunteers of the Tauheedul Islam (TI) died when one of them stepped over a landmine planted near a bunker in Kata Kanri area of Bazaar Zakhakhel in Khyber Agency.

On 16th January, dozens of activists of Khyber Youth Welfare Association and other tribesmen from Khyber Agency staged a protest for the recovery of missing persons from the Bara tehsil.

On 16th January, United Nations International Children and Education Fund (Unicef) handed over 60 tents to the Khyber Agency education office to provide shelter to the students of the militancy destroyed schools in the region.

On 17th January, a security personnel was killed and another injured in a remote-controlled bomb blast in Sadukhel area of Landikotal tehsil in Khyber Agency.

On 18th January, family members of two Khassadar personnel separately killed in a suicide attack and military operation in January 2012 demanded the Khyber Agency political administration to provide them financial compensation and jobs to the sons of the slain men as per commitment.

Orakzai Agency

On 18th January, tribal people displaced from upper Orakzai Agency asked the government to make arrangements for sending them back home.

Kurram Agency

North Waziristan Agency

On 14th January, curfew was imposed for an indefinite period across the North Waziristan Agency.

On 18th January, tribal people from North Waziristan protested the security forces' operation in Mir Ali tehsil conducted on December 19 last year, urging the government to compensate the families of those killed in the offensive.

South Waziristan Agency

No incident was reported in the week.

KPK

On 13th January, six persons, including three policemen, were killed as two roadside blasts occurred near his convoy in the Martung area in Puran tehsil in Shangla.

On 13th January, Interior Minister Chaudhry Nisar said the Mullah Fazlullah-led Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) has rejected the dialogue offer but the government still believes in negotiations, which remains its prime priority.

On 13th January, Mian Mushtaq, a senior leader of the Awami National Party (ANP), his driver and a party worker were killed when armed motorcyclists opened fire on his car in Mashokhel village.

On 13th January, for the first time in the history of Swat district, women took part in a Jirga held in Barikot tehsil.

On 13th January, Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa (KPK) government announced that it will give Rs5 million to Aitizaz Hasan's family.

On 13th January, a traffic constable was injured by unidentified armed motorcyclists in the Link Road neighborhood of Swabi city.

On 13th January, Awami National Party assured that it will provide full support to the federal government in dealing with terrorism and for restoration of peace if any such request is made to the party.

On 13th January, Jamiat Ulema-i-Islam-F parliamentary leader in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Assembly Maulana Lutf ur Rehman said that the ruling parties in the province and centre should honour 'people's mandate' and hold talks with Taliban to restore peace in the country.

On 13th January, police arrested 20 criminals including five proclaimed offenders during a search operation in Peshawar.

On 14th January, eleven political parties of the country have approved a reforms agenda for bringing the Federally Administrated Tribal Areas (Fata) into the national fold and asked the government to give those rights to the Fata people that are being availed by the other Pakistanis.

On 14th January, a remote-controlled bomb blast near Dera Ismail Khan left eight police officers injured.

On 14th January, unidentified persons on a motorcycle killed a security agency official in Swabi.

On 14th January, in a separate incident, four bullet-riddled bodies were found in Thana Azakhel.

On 14th January, a roadside blast injured a policeman and damaged a vehicle in Garhi Millikhel area on the outskirts of provincial metropolis.

On 14th January, a man and his wife were killed and four others received injuries in a clash between a landowner and peasants in Shakoor area in Charsadda.

On 16th January, a cop was killed in Regi Model Town area of the city when a bomb planted near a police check post went off in Peshawar.

On 16th January, six bodies were found in Nowshera and Dera Ismail Khan District of the province.

On 16th January, Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif approved in principle the establishment of a `brigade-level` cantonment for Swat and Malakand areas.

On 16th January, unidentified assailants attacked the house of Chief Minister's adviser on prisons Malik Qasim Khan Khattak with hand grenades, causing damage to the main gate of the house. However, no loss of life was reported.

On 16th January, advisor on prisons, Malik Mohammad Qasim told the provincial assembly that 253 prisoners including 23 terrorists had run away during last year's jailbreak in Dera Ismail Khan.

On 16th January, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Assembly unanimously passed "The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Right to Public Services bill 2014" enabling every eligible persons to have right to public services within a time limit and in a transparent manner.

On 16th January, Senator Farhat Ullah Babur along with Humayon Khan and other members in a delegation visited the Ibrahim Zai District of Hangu to pay condolences to the family of Aitzaz Hassan.

On 17th January, eight persons were killed and more than 60 injured when a bomb went off during Maghrib prayers inside the jam-packed mosque in the Tableeghi Markaz near Shami Road Peshawar.

On 17th January, police defused a bomb planted near the Tableeghi Markaz in Rahman Colony in Nowshera Cantonment.

On 17th January, Opposition Leader in National Assembly, Khursheed Shah, said that the government had admitted its failure in dialogue with the Taliban for talk.

On 17th January, Ministry of Defence informed the Peshawar High Court (PHC) that 21 missing persons have been traced and shifted to various internment centres as they were declared hardcore militants by the secret agencies.

On 17th January, a body of an unidentified man was found in the limits of Sardheri Police Station Charsadda.

On 14th January, hujra of the Awami National Party (ANP) leader was partially damaged in an explosion in Serai Naurang tehsil of Lakki Marwat.

On 17th January, Interior Minister Chaudhry Nisar Ali Khan said the government had re-started the dialogue process with the militants.

On 17th January, findings of a baseline study showed that jirga is the most effective forum for resolution of disputes in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province as compared to formal institutions.

On 17th January, Station House Officer (SHO) and at least two other policemen were injured in a remote-controlled bomb blast in Shangla.

On 17th January, TTP rejected any claims of involvement on Peshawar Tableegi Markaz and have accused the government as using such tactics to produce negative image of militants.

On 17th January, Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif rejected the fear of people that Mullah Fazalullah can come back to Swat.

On 18th January, WHO announced that Peshawar is the world's largest pool of polio virus, with the vast majority of cases in the country and neighboring Afghanistan tracing back to the restive city.

On 19th January 2014, Peshawar High Court (PHC) Chief Justice Dost Muhammad Khan claimed that through the high court intervention as many as 3,033 missing persons were traced and 1,270 of them reached their homes safely.

On 19th January, internally displaced families demanded of the government to arrange for their early repatriation to respective tribal areas after remaining stranded for past six years out of their tribal agencies.
